We fully understand that impact that Covid-19 has had on your business. And as such, The Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs together with Tourism KwaZulu-Natal have put aside a budget of R20 million in funds to give you a little help. We know that this isn't enough to go around as most tourism businesses are struggling – but a little really does go a long way. Things will get better, soon.

As a tourism enterprise owner, you qualify for a once off application capped at R50 000.

Criteria for tourism, hospitality and travel related businesses

1. An enterprise must be officially registered with relevant business registration authorities such as Companies and Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC) and those operating as Sole Proprietors.
2. An enterprise must also be registered or in the progress of registration with the KZN Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (EDTEA).
3. An enterprise must be generating a turnover not exceeding R10 million per business financial year prior to March 2020.
4. An enterprise must be compliant with all tax regulations and in possession of a valid tax clearance certificate.
5. An enterprise should not have benefited from the National and provincial Tourism Relief Fund.

Applications will be evaluated by an independent assessor for verification and will be assessed by a screening committee.

Applications opened on **27 September 2021** and close on **29 October 2021**. Application forms are accessible online from the official TKZN website: www.zulu.org.za

A call-centre has been set up to guide and provide information to applicants.

The completed online application forms together with supporting documents must be uploaded and submitted on the online system of applications.

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As someone operating as a tour guide, you qualify for a once application capped at R4500

Criteria for Tour Guide

1. Be registered as a tour guide with the provincial Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (EDTEA).
2. Must have been in service for a period of one year or more before the emergence of the pandemic.
3. Not benefitted from the National Tourism Relief Fund for Tour Guides.
4. The submitted online applications for Tour Guides must be accompanied by the following compulsory supporting documents: Completed online application form, Copy of registration as a Tour Guide; and certified ID copy.

Applications will be evaluated by an independent assessor for verification and will be assessed by a screening committee.

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The once off grant amount for Destination Management Companies (DMCs) shall be capped at R50 000 per applicant.

Criteria for Destination Management Companies (DMCs), Professional Conference Organisers (PCOs), Incentive Buyers and Exhibition Companies

1. Be officially registered with relevant business registration authorities such as Companies and Intellectual Property Commission (CIPC) and those operating as Sole Proprietors.
2. Be registered or be in the process of registering with the KZN Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs (EDTEA).
3. Be generating a turnover not exceeding R10 million per business financial year prior to March 2020.
4. Be compliant with all tax regulations and be in possession of a valid tax clearance certificate.
5. Must not have benefited from either the National or the Provincial Tourism Relief Fund.
6. **Be registered with professional associations such as the Southern African Association for the Conference Industry (SAACI), Southern Africa Tourism Services Association (SATSA) and the Exhibition Association of South Africa (EXSA).**

Applications will be evaluated by an independent assessor for verification and will be assessed by a screening committee.

THE KZN TOURISM RELIEF FUND FOR ARTS & CRAFT CO-OPERATIVES



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The once off grant amount for Arts and Craft co-ops shall be capped at R10 000.

The criteria for Arts and Craft Co-operatives

1. Be a registered Arts and Craft Co-operative or sole proprietor operating in the province, providing its products to tourists.
2. In service for one year or more and have not benefited from the National or Provincial Tourism Relief Fund.
3. The submitted online applications for crafters' cooperative must be accompanied by the following compulsory supporting documents: completed online application form, copy of registration as cooperative or sole propriety and certified ID copy.

Applications will be evaluated by an independent assessor for verification and will be assessed by a screening committee.

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The once off grant amount for traditional performers attached to accommodation establishments and attractions shall be capped at R10 000.

The criteria for traditional performance groups attached to tourism establishments and attractions

1. Be traditional performers operating in the province, providing entertainment through performance for visitors/tourists.
2. In service for one year or more before Covid-19.
3. Letter of confirmation of service from the tourism establishment and/or attraction and certified ID copy of the group manager.

Applications will be evaluated by an independent assessor for verification and will be assessed by a screening committee.

THE KZN TOURISM RELIEF FUND FOR RICKSHAW OPERATORS



KEEPING TOURISM ALIVE

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The once off grant amount for Rickshaw Operators shall be capped at R4 500 per applicant.

The criteria for Rickshaw Operators

1. Be registered as an informal trader with eThekweni municipality.
2. In service for one year or more before Covid-19.
3. Certified ID copy of the applicant

Applications will be evaluated by an independent assessor for verification and will be assessed by a screening committee.

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
